

Medical Waste Diversion: Recycling of Non-Contaminated, Single-use Gloves At BC Cancer - Vancouver

Background

- The health care sector is a significant contributor to industrial waste in Canada. This has serious implications for human health, green house gas emissions, and even the psychological wellbeing of health care workers.
- Single-use, non-contaminated gloves are a high contributor to medical waste. A single nitrile glove
 (~3.2g) has a carbon footprint of 26g CO2e, and may take over 100 years to decompose in a landfill.

Questions

- . What proportion of used single-use gloves in BC Cancer Vancouver's RT ACU, PR East, and PR West are non-contaminated?
- II. Will the introduction of a purpose-built recycling box for non-contaminated single-use gloves change the proportion of gloves that are disposed of for recycling?

Approach

- We established a weight-based method for measuring the total number of gloves that were used in the RT ACU, PR East and PR West at the Vancouver Centre:
 - **First**, we audited glove use twice a day in each of the care areas for one week.
 - **Second**, we introduced (A) a purpose-built recycling box, and (B) a communication intervention to raise awareness about the recycling of single-use, non-contaminated glove recycling among clinicians and staff.
 - Last, we audited glove use twice a day in each of the care areas for an additional one week period.

Results

- The majority of single-use gloves that are used in RT ACU, PR East, and PR West were noncontaminated and, therefore, are eligible to be recycled.
- We diverted 247 (830g) of single-use, non-contaminated nitrile gloves from the landfill.
- During the second week of auditing, the proportion of non-contaminated gloves that were eligible to be recycled was consistently over 90%.

Learnings & Next Steps

- Staff are willing to engage in new practices that disrupt the production of medical waste.
- Decreasing medical waste is one strategy in concert with other actions across different levels – to address the health care industry's impact on the climate and environment.
- Next Steps:
 - Expansion to other areas of Vancouver Centre
 - Expansion to other regional Centres
