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AIM: TO DECREASE THE USE OF SINGLE-USE DISPOSABLE BLUE PADS BY 90% DURING THE INFUSOR DISCONNECT PROCEDURE AT BCC ABBOTSFORD TASK CLINIC BY AUGUST 2024.



Pre-implementation: The blue pads were used solely to organize supplies and were disposed of as cytotoxic waste. They are not clinically integral to the procedure.






The incineration of cytotoxic waste are harmful to human and environmental health.



Equivalent to the greenhouse gas emissions of 10 propane cylinders.



Equivalent to 1,500 square feet, which is half the size of a standard tennis court.




OUTCOME: 100% DECREASE IN THE USE OF BLUE PADS.
